- Leverage and develop local and national partnerships to introduce sustainable interventions that reduce cancer risk in communities where IPVC is held.

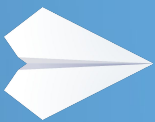
Intended Impact:

- Increase public understanding of HPV and cancer prevention strategies in host countries.
- Overcome demographic and socioeconomic barriers to healthcare access to reduce inequities in access to cancer prevention.
- Tackle low vaccination and cervical screening rates in future host destinations of Bangkok and Athens.

Intended Use of Grant Funding:

- **Launch targeted social media campaigns** in local languages to boost awareness of HPV and related cancers.
- **Develop localized information pages on [AskAboutHPV.org](https://www.askabout HPV.org)**, offering culturally relevant information, including how to access to vaccination and screening resources.
- **Illuminate iconic buildings and landmarks in purple** to spark public engagement, supported by PR and media engagement.
- **Deliver interactive HPV education sessions** for school-aged children, aligned with immunisation schedules.
- **Train the next generation of healthcare providers** using HPV-focused educational modules.
- **Provide community-based vaccination and cervical screenings** to underserved communities.

Evidence of impact:

At IPVC 2024 in Scotland – which earned the 2023 Incredible Impacts Programme Seed Grant – IPVS delivered measurable and lasting results:

- Established a nationwide HPV information hub, reaching thousands of people across Scotland.
- Engaged over 1,200 students in educational workshops, contributing to a notable rise in vaccination uptake.
- Embedded HPV education into academic and community frameworks, ensuring long-term benefits beyond the event itself.
- Inspired the development of the EICC Impact Network to empower national and international clients with the tools and connections needed to deliver purposeful legacy activity.
